RESOLUTION APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING A FORM OF LOAN AGREEMENT AND AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$5,260,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION CAPITAL LOAN NOTES, SERIES 2018, AND LEVYING A TAX TO PAY SAID NOTES; APPROVAL OF THE TAX EXEMPTION CERTIFICATE.

WHEREAS, the Issuer is a political subdivision, organized and exists under and by virtue of the laws and Constitution of the State of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, the Issuer is in need of funds to pay costs of the Project as defined herein, and has taken all actions necessary to authorize general obligation bonds for such purposes; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 331.445 of the Code of Iowa, it is hereby found and determined that the various purposes comprising the Project shall be combined for the purpose of issuance in a single issue of \$9,765,000 General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, Series 2018, as hereinafter set forth; and

WHEREAS, the above mentioned Notes were heretofore sold and action should now be taken to issue said Notes conforming to the terms and conditions of the best bid received at the sale.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved:

<u>Section 1. Definitions</u>. The following terms shall have the following meanings in this Resolution unless the text expressly or by necessary implication requires otherwise:

- "Issuer" and "County" shall mean Pottawattamie County, State of Iowa.
- "Loan Agreement" shall mean a Loan Agreement between the Issuer and a lender or lenders in substantially the form attached to and approved by this Resolution.
- "Note Fund" shall mean the fund created in Section 3 of this Resolution.
- "Notes" shall mean \$5,260,000 General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, Series 2018, authorized to be issued by this Resolution.
- "Paying Agent" shall mean Bankers Trust Company, or such successor as may be approved by Issuer as provided herein and who shall carry out the duties prescribed herein as Issuer's agent to provide for the payment of principal of and interest on the Notes as the same shall become due.
- "Project" shall mean the:
- a) equipping public buildings with computers and software from the Zuercher Suite pertaining to document management, storage and retrieval, in an amount not to exceed \$550,000;
- b) peace officer communication equipment and other emergency services communication equipment and system provided in the Zuercher Suite, radio upgrades and improvements to the Carson Tower, in an amount not to exceed \$1,300,000;
- c) equipping, remodeling and reconstruction of the Sheriff's Department and the Jail, in an amount not to exceed \$520,000;
- d) works and facilities useful for the collection and disposal of solid waste, including vehicles and buildings used for recycling, in an amount not to exceed \$370,000;
- e) equipping of public buildings including the digitalization of records in the County Recorder's office, in an amount not to exceed \$120,000;
- f) equipping, remodeling and reconstructing the Courthouse basement, in an amount not to exceed \$300,000;

- g) equipping, remodeling and reconstructing the first floor of the Courthouse, in an amount not to exceed \$900,000;
- h) architectural and engineering studies, plans and designs for the future equipping, remodeling, reconstruction and extension of the current Law Enforcement Center building, in an amount not to exceed \$900,000;
- i) vehicles for the Sheriff's Department.
- "Project Fund" shall mean the fund required to be established by this Resolution for the deposit of the proceeds of the Notes.
- "Rebate Fund" shall mean the fund so defined in and established pursuant to the Tax Exemption Certificate.
- "Registrar" shall mean Bankers Trust Company of Des Moines, Iowa, or such successor as may be approved by Issuer as provided herein and who shall carry out the duties prescribed herein with respect to maintaining a register of the owners of the Notes. Unless otherwise specified, the Registrar shall also act as Transfer Agent for the Notes.
- "Resolution" shall mean this resolution authorizing the Notes.
- "Tax Exemption Certificate" shall mean the Tax Exemption Certificate approved under the terms of this Resolution and to be executed by the County Treasurer and delivered at the time of issuance and delivery of the Notes.
- "Treasurer" shall mean the County Treasurer or such other officer as shall succeed to the same duties and responsibilities with respect to the recording and payment of the Notes issued hereunder.

Section 2. Levy and Certification of Annual Tax; Other Funds to be Used.

a) <u>Levy of Annual Tax</u>. That for the purpose of providing funds to pay the principal and interest of the Notes hereinafter authorized to be issued, there is hereby levied for each future year the following direct annual tax on all of the taxable property in Pottawattamie County, State of Iowa, to-wit:

b) <u>Resolution to be Filed With County Auditor</u>. A certified copy of this Resolution shall be filed with the Auditor of Pottawattamie County,

Iowa and the Auditor is hereby instructed in and for each of the years as provided, to levy and assess the tax hereby authorized in Section 2 of this Resolution, in like manner as other taxes are levied and assessed, and such taxes so levied in and for each of the years aforesaid be collected in like manner as other taxes of the County are collected, and when collected be used for the purpose of paying principal and interest on said Notes issued in anticipation of the tax, and for no other purpose whatsoever.

c) <u>Additional County Funds Available</u>. Principal and interest coming due at any time when the proceeds of said tax on hand shall be insufficient to pay the same shall be promptly paid when due from current funds of the County available for that purpose and reimbursement shall be made from such special fund in the amounts thus advanced.

<u>Section 3.</u> Note Fund. Said tax shall be assessed and collected each year at the same time and in the same manner as, and in addition to, all other taxes in and for the County, and when collected they shall be converted into a special fund within the Debt Service Fund to be known as the "GENERAL OBLIGATION CAPITAL LOAN NOTE FUND NO. 1" (the "Note Fund"), which is hereby pledged for and shall be used only for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Notes hereinafter authorized to be issued; and also there shall be apportioned to said fund its proportion of taxes received by the County from property that is centrally assessed by the State of Iowa.

<u>Section4.</u> <u>Application of Note Proceeds</u>. Proceeds of the Notes, other than accrued interest except as may be provided below, shall be credited to the Project Fund and expended therefrom for the purposes of issuance. Any amounts on hand in the Project Fund shall be available for the payment of the principal of or interest on the Notes at any time that other funds shall be insufficient to the purpose, in which event such funds shall be repaid to the Project Fund at the earliest opportunity. Any balance on hand in the Project Fund and not immediately required for its purposes may be invested not inconsistent with limitations provided by law or this Resolution.

<u>Section 5. Investment of Note Fund Proceeds</u>. All moneys held in the Note Fund, provided for by Section 3 of this Resolution shall be invested in investments permitted by Chapter 12B, Code of Iowa, 2017, as amended, or deposited in financial institutions which are members of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and the deposits in which are insured thereby and all such deposits exceeding the maximum amount insured from time to time by FDIC or its equivalent successor in any one financial institution shall be continuously secured in compliance with Chapter 12C of the Code of Iowa, 2017, as amended, or otherwise by a valid pledge of direct obligations of the United States Government having an equivalent market value. All such interim investments shall mature before the date on which the moneys are required for payment of principal of or interest on the Notes as herein provided.

Section 6. Note Details, Execution and Redemption.

a) <u>Note Details</u>. General Obligation Capital Loan Notes of the County in the amount of \$5,260,000, shall be issued to evidence the obligations of the Issuer under the Loan Agreement pursuant to the provisions of Sections 331.402, 331.442, 331.443 and 331.445 of the Code of Iowa for the aforesaid purposes. The Notes shall be issued in one or more series and shall be secured equally and ratably from the sources provided in Section 3 of this Resolution. The Notes shall be designated "GENERAL OBLIGATION CAPITAL LOAN NOTE, SERIES 2018", be dated March 6, 2018, and bear interest from the

date thereof, until payment thereof, at the office of the Paying Agent, said interest payable on December 1, 2018, and semiannually thereafter on the 1st day of June and December in each year until maturity at the rates hereinafter provided.

The Notes shall be executed by the manual or facsimile signature of the Chairperson and attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the Auditor, and impressed or printed with the seal of the County and shall be fully registered as to both principal and interest as provided in this Resolution; principal, interest and premium, if any, shall be payable at the office of the Paying Agent by mailing of a check to the registered owner of the Note. The Notes shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 or multiples thereof. The Notes shall mature and bear interest as follows:

b) Redemption.

<u>Optional Redemption</u>. Notes maturing after June 1, 2023, may be called for optional redemption by the Issuer on that date or any date thereafter, from any funds regardless of source, in whole or from time to time in part, in any order of maturity and within an annual maturity by lot. The terms of redemption shall be par, plus accrued interest to date of call.

Thirty days' written notice of redemption shall be given to the registered owner of the Note. Failure to give written notice to any registered owner of the Notes or any defect therein shall not affect the validity of any proceedings for the redemption of the Notes. All Notes or portions thereof called for redemption will cease to bear interest after the specified redemption date, provided funds for their redemption are on deposit at the place of payment. Written notice will be deemed completed upon transmission to the owner of record.

If selection by lot within a maturity is required, the Registrar shall designate the Notes to be redeemed by random selection of the names of the registered owners of the entire annual maturity until the total amount of Notes to be called has been reached.

Section 7. Registration of Notes; Appointment of Registrar; Transfer; Ownership; Delivery; and Cancellation.

a) <u>Registration</u>. The ownership of Notes may be transferred only by the making of an entry upon the books kept for the registration and transfer of ownership of the Notes, and in no other way. Bankers Trust Company is hereby appointed as Note Registrar under the terms of this Resolution and under the provisions of a separate agreement with the Issuer filed herewith which is made a part hereof by this reference. Registrar shall maintain the books of the Issuer for the registration of ownership of the Notes for the payment of principal of and interest on the Notes as provided in this Resolution. All Notes shall be negotiable

as provided in Article 8 of the Uniform Commercial Code and Section 331.446 of the Code of Iowa, subject to the provisions for registration and transfer contained in the Notes and in this Resolution.

- b) Transfer. The ownership of any Note may be transferred only upon the Registration Books kept for the registration and transfer of Notes and only upon surrender thereof at the office of the Registrar together with an assignment duly executed by the holder or his duly authorized attorney in fact in such form as shall be satisfactory to the Registrar, along with the address and social security number or federal employer identification number of such transferee (or, if registration is to be made in the name of multiple individuals, of all such transferees). In the event that the address of the registered owner of a Note (other than a registered owner which is the nominee of the broker or dealer in question) is that of a broker or dealer, there must be disclosed on the Registration Books the information pertaining to the registered owner required above. Upon the transfer of any such Note, a new fully registered Note, of any denomination or denominations permitted by this Resolution in aggregate principal amount equal to the unmatured and unredeemed principal amount of such transferred fully registered Note, and bearing interest at the same rate and maturing on the same date or dates shall be delivered by the Registrar.
- c) <u>Registration of Transferred Notes</u>. In all cases of the transfer of the Notes, the Registrar shall register, at the earliest practicable time, on the Registration Books, the Notes, in accordance with the provisions of this Resolution.
- d) <u>Ownership</u>. As to any Note, the person in whose name the ownership of the same shall be registered on the Registration Books of the Registrar shall be deemed and regarded as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes, and payment of or on account of the principal of any such Notes and the premium, if any, and interest thereon shall be made only to or upon the order of the registered owner thereof or his legal representative. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon such Note, including the interest thereon, to the extent of the sum or sums so paid.
- e) <u>Cancellation</u>. All Notes which have been redeemed shall not be reissued but shall be cancelled by the Registrar. All Notes which are cancelled by the Registrar shall be destroyed and a certificate of the destruction thereof shall be furnished promptly to the Issuer; provided that if the Issuer shall so direct, the Registrar shall forward the cancelled Notes to the Issuer.
- f) <u>Non-Presentment of Notes</u>. In the event any payment check representing payment of principal of or interest on the Notes is returned to the Paying Agent or if any note is not presented for payment of principal at the maturity or redemption date, if funds sufficient to pay such principal of or interest on Notes shall have been made available to the Paying Agent for the benefit of the owner thereof, all liability of the Issuer to the owner thereof for such interest or payment of such Notes shall forthwith cease, terminate and be completely discharged, and hereupon it shall be the duty of the Paying Agent to hold such funds, without liability for interest thereon, for the

benefit of the owner of such Notes who shall thereafter be restricted exclusively to such funds for any claim of whatever nature on his part under this Resolution or on, or with respect to, such interest or Notes. The Paying Agent's obligation to hold such funds shall continue for a period equal to two years and six months following the date on which such interest or principal became due, whether at maturity, or at the date fixed for redemption thereof, or otherwise, at which time the Paying Agent, shall surrender any remaining funds so held to the Issuer, whereupon any claim under this Resolution by the Owners of such interest or Notes of whatever nature shall be made upon the Issuer.

g) <u>Registration and Transfer Fees</u>. The Registrar may furnish to each owner, at the Issuer's expense, one note for each annual maturity. The Registrar shall furnish additional Notes in lesser denominations (but not less than the minimum denomination) to an owner who so requests.

Section 8. Reissuance of Mutilated, Destroyed, Stolen or Lost Notes. In case any outstanding Note shall become mutilated or be destroyed, stolen or lost, the Issuer shall at the request of Registrar authenticate and deliver a new Note of like tenor and amount as the Note so mutilated, destroyed, stolen or lost, in exchange and substitution for such mutilated Note to Registrar, upon surrender of such mutilated Note, or in lieu of and substitution for the Note destroyed, stolen or lost, upon filing with the Registrar evidence satisfactory to the Registrar and Issuer that such Note has been destroyed, stolen or lost and proof of ownership thereof, and upon furnishing the Registrar and Issuer with satisfactory indemnity and complying with such other reasonable regulations as the Issuer or its agent may prescribe and paying such expenses as the Issuer may incur in connection therewith.

<u>Section 9.</u> Record Date. Payments of principal and interest, otherwise than upon full redemption, made in respect of any Note, shall be made to the registered holder thereof or to their designated agent as the same appear on the books of the Registrar on the 15th day of the month preceding the payment date. All such payments shall fully discharge the obligations of the Issuer in respect of such Notes to the extent of the payments so made. Upon receipt of the final payment of principal, the holder of the Note shall surrender the Note to the Paying Agent.

<u>Section 10.</u> Execution, Authentication and Delivery of the Notes. Upon the adoption of this Resolution, the Chairperson and Auditor shall execute the Notes by their manual or authorized signature and deliver the Notes to the Registrar, who shall authenticate the Notes and deliver the same to or upon order of the Purchaser. No Note shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose or shall be entitled to any right or benefit hereunder unless the Registrar shall duly endorse and execute on such Note a Certificate of Authentication substantially in the form of the Certificate herein set forth. Such Certificate upon any Note executed on behalf of the Issuer shall be conclusive evidence that the Note so authenticated has been duly issued under this Resolution and that the holder thereof is entitled to the benefits of this Resolution.

No Notes shall be authenticated and delivered by the Registrar unless and until there shall have been provided the following:

1. A certified copy of the resolution of Issuer approving the execution of a Loan Agreement and a copy of the Loan Agreement;

- 2. A written order of Issuer signed by the County Treasurer of the Issuer directing the authentication and delivery of the Notes to or upon the order of the Purchaser upon payment of the purchase price as set forth therein;
- 3. The approving opinion of Ahlers & Cooney, P.C., Bond Counsel, concerning the validity and legality of all the Notes proposed to be issued.

7.25.010 PURPOSE: The purpose of this ordinance is to prohibit the excessive, loud, unusual or explosive use of engine retarding and compressed air-braking devices within designated areas in Pottawattamie County.

7.25.020 DEFINITIONS: For the purposes of this ordinance the following words and phrases are defined as follows:

1. "Engine retarding brake" means a "Dynamic Brake", "Jake Brake", "Jacobs Brake", "C-Brake", "Compression Brake", "Paccar Brake", transmission brake or any other engine retarding brake system that alters the normal compression of the engine and subsequently releases that compression in such a manner as to emit more than 80 decibels of noise within/at a distance of/more than 50 feet.

7.25.030 PROHIBITIONS: It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to use or operate or cause to be used or operated within designated areas in the unincorporated areas of the County of Pottawattamie, State of Iowa, any engine retarding brake, compression brake or mechanical exhaust device designed to aid in the braking or deceleration of any vehicle that results in excessive, loud, unusual or explosive noise from such vehicle, unless such use is necessary to avoid imminent danger/emergency/to avoid injury or accident. Such prohibition shall be applicable only to those public highways or portions specifically identified in this Chapter.

7.25.040 AREAS OF PROHIBITION: The prohibition set forth herein shall apply to the following public highways in Pottawattamie County, Iowa or portions thereof:

1. US Highway 92 from 230th Street to the Council Bluffs Corporate Limits.

7.25.050 SIGNAGE : Signs stating "VEHICLE NOISE LAWS ENFORCED" or "ENGINE BRAKE ORDINANCE ENFORCED" may be installed at locations deemed appropriate by the Board of Supervisors to advise motorists of the prohibitions contained in this ordinance, except that no sign stating "VEHICLE NOISE LAWS ENFORCED" or "ENGINE BRAKE ORDINANCE ENFORCED" shall be installed on a state highway without a permit from the Iowa Department of Transportation. The provisions of this ordinance shall be in full force and effect even if no signs are installed.

7.25.060 EXCEPTIONS: Emergency vehicles shall be exempt from the application of this ordinance.

7.25.070 VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES: ordinance is deemed to be a county infraction. The penalty for violating any of the provisions of this Chapter shall be as set forth in Chapter 1.75.

SECTION 3 - SEVERABILITY: If any of the provisions of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances are held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION 4 - REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES: All ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

SECTION 5 – CONFLICTING REGULATIONS: Where there exists a conflict between any of the regulations or limitations prescribed in this Ordinance and any other regulations applicable to the same area, whether the conflict be with respect to the height of structures or trees, and use of land, or any other matter, the more stringent limitation or requirement shall govern and prevail.

SECTION 6 - EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

It is further agreed to and approved by the Board, that the City of Council Bluffs shall be notified they may occupy their current space in the LEC, under the current terms and conditions until December 31, 2018.

RESOLUTION NO. 27-2018

WHEREAS the Pottawattamie County is the owner of the Pottawattamie County Courthouse and the Law Enforcement Center (LEC) located at 227 South 6th Street, Council Bluffs, Iowa; and

WHEREAS the Pottawattamie County Board of Supervisors has direct control over the Pottawattamie County Courthouse and the LEC which were officially dedicated and opened to the public on November 20, 1977; and

WHEREAS, construction of the LEC was funded in major part with a federal grant from the U.S. Department of Justice, a state law enforcement grant and matching funds of the City of Council Bluffs and Pottawattamie County; and

WHEREAS, when the LEC was constructed, it was intended to house both the Council Bluffs Police Department (Police Department) and the Pottawattamie County Sheriff's Office (Sheriff), and to support criminal justice matters in Pottawattamie County; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department has occupied LEC at 227 South 6th Street, Council Bluffs Iowa for over 40 years pursuant to a Grant of Right to Occupy and Covenant dated December 15, 1981 (LEC Agreement); and

WHEREAS, the LEC Agreement designates the areas to be used by the Police Department, areas to be used by the Sheriff, and common areas to be shared by both the Police Department and the Sheriff; and

WHEREAS, in approximately 1999, the Sheriff vacated its space at the LEC when it moved into its new office at 1400 Big Lake Road, Council Bluffs, Iowa; and

WHEREAS, since 1999, the Police Department has occupied the entire LEC, although no new agreement was executed between the City and the County; and

WHEREAS, the LEC is no longer adequate to support the Police Department because the Police Department "has exceeded the lifespan and space of its current headquarters" building which "limits the police department's ability to effectively and efficiently serve the community"; and

WHEREAS, on May 3, 2016, the City of Council Bluffs held a special election to approve a \$20 million bond to fund the construction of a new headquarters for the Police Department, which passed; and

WHEREAS, following approval of the city's bond election, in anticipation of the Police Department vacating the LEC, the County conducted a needs assessment for the LEC in July 2017 which recommended "total demolition of police areas"; that most systems in the LEC had met or exceeded their useful life; and that significant upgrades were necessary to meet compliance with city building codes and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements; and

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2018, the Council Bluffs City Council approved general obligation bonds in the amount of \$11.8 million for the completion of the new Police Department headquarters on Woodbury Avenue in Council Bluffs; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department is expected to vacate the LEC and move into its new headquarters by the end of 2018, after which neither the Police Department nor the Sheriff will occupy any space at the LEC; and

WHEREAS, the LEC Agreement provides that termination of the LEC Agreement may be accomplished either by mutual agreement of the City Council and the Board of Supervisors; or "upon the expiration of the useful life of the Law Enforcement Center structure, as determined by the Pottawattamie County Board of Supervisors, whichever occurs first"; and

WHEREAS, on March 6, 2018, in anticipation of the Police Department vacating the LEC, the Board of Supervisors requested that the City Council mutually agree to terminate the LEC Agreement; and

WHEREAS, on March 28, 2018, the City Council sent a letter to the Board of Supervisors requesting to mediate a compromise and financial settlement to the City when the Police Department vacates the LEC, effectively refusing the Board of Supervisor's request to mutually agree to terminate the LEC Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the LEC Agreement does not require that the County make a financial settlement to the City upon the Police Department vacating the LEC; and

WHEREAS, the LEC Agreement provides that the Board of Supervisors may determine that the "useful life" of the LEC structure has expired; and

WHEREAS, State of Iowa, as well as industry and professional resources, provide that the "useful life" of a government building falls in a range of between 20 to 50 years; and

WHEREAS, construction began on the LEC in 1974 and no major renovations have been conducted on the LEC in over 40 years; and

WHEREAS the County has received information from HGM Associates Inc. that future use of the LEC structure requires demolition and renovations of approximately \$2 million to modernize the LEC structure and bring it into compliance with local building codes and state and federal and laws.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Pottawattamie County Board of Supervisors as follows:

1. The County Attorney has presented the Board of Supervisors with an extensive history of the LEC and an extensive number of documents related to the LEC, and provided legal

authority and advice concerning the rights and obligations of the City and the County as related to the LEC.

2. Following a review of the history and documents related to the LEC, the Board finds that LEC Agreement does not require a financial payment to the City when the Police Department vacates the LEC later this year.

3. The Board of Supervisors has received and reviewed information from the County Attorney concerning the history and useful life of the LEC; has reviewed information from the City that the LEC structure has exceeded its lifespan and does not comply with the ADA; and has received and reviewed an engineering recommendation that future use of the LEC structure requires demolition and renovations of approximately \$2 million to bring the space into compliance with local, state and federal building codes and laws.

4. Having given consideration to the aforementioned information, the Board determines that the useful life of the LEC has expired.

RESOLUTION OPPOSING REDUCTION IN BACKFILL FOR 2018/19 BACKFILL

WHEREAS, when the Iowa Legislature decided to cut commercial property taxes in 2013, that decision which reduced income to Iowa's cities, counties, school districts and other local governments; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature agreed to replace those lost dollars with state dollars. That decision protected communities from a cut in services or forcing an increase in property taxes. This replacement of the local income lost due to the legislature's decision is known as the "backfill"; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF POTTAWATTAMIE COUNTY, that

A. Pottawattamie County is opposed to any reduction in the backfill for the 2018-2019 backfill, and that this opposition should be communicated to the Iowa Legislature and to Governor Reynolds; and

B. Pottawattamie County believes that changes to the backfill should be decided with the participation of local governmental leaders, with adequate notice, and that every effort be made to avoid local property tax increases.

 - A. Zoning requirements for minimum size and access can be met.
 - B. Adjoins buildable platted property (not outlots) on rear and sides or property has double frontage.
 - C. Existing parcel is more than four times the minimum parcel size in respective zoning district.

- D. Does not cause conflict with future access or development to subject parcel and/or adjacent parcels.
- .02 A *minor subdivision* plat may also be prepared for an existing parcel being divided where one of the following conditions is present toward the number of parcels within a tract of record where an existing parcel crosses section, quarter section, or quarter quarter section line or an original line of a Government Lot.
 - A. The tract of record that contains the majority of the area of an individual parcel that crosses the above referenced line(s) is the tract of record that the division counts toward and the other portion does not count as a parcel in the adjacent tract of record.
 - B. If the existing parcel crosses any of the above referenced line(s), a parcel can be split on said line if all new parcels created can meet the requirements of the Zoning Ordinance including size and access, the subdivision may be conducted as a minor subdivision because no new parcels are being created within the tract of record.
 - C. A lot labeled as an outlot does not count toward parcels for subdivision purposes within the 1/4-1/4.)
- .03 A *minor subdivision* plat may also be prepared for an existing parcel that lies within a *Quarter Quarter section* that is divided by a *public road*. There shall be a maximum of four (4) parcels on both sides of said road.

WHEREAS, Pillar Technology, LLC is considering expanding their operations in Iowa by leasing 8,000 SF of space at 4200 River's Edge Parkway, Building One - 3rd Floor, Council Bluffs, Iowa (Pottawattamie County) for the purpose of providing technology and software development services to companies in the region; and

WHEREAS, Pillar Technology, LLC will create 30 full-time jobs in Council Bluffs at an average wage rate of \$59.00 per hour plus benefits; and

WHEREAS, the project budget is \$1,840,000 for facility build-out and first three years of lease payments; and

WHEREAS, Pillar Technology, LLC has requested withholding tax credits from the State of Iowa under the Targeted Jobs Withholding Tax Credit Program; and

WHEREAS, Section 519 of the Department of Veteran Affairs and U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, and Independent Agencies Appropriations Act of 1990 requires that all CDBG recipients adopt and enforce a policy to prohibit the use of excessive force by law enforcement agencies within the recipient's jurisdiction against any individuals engaged in non-violent civil rights demonstrations; and

WHEREAS, all recipients of CDBG funds are further required to follow a policy of enforcing applicable state and local laws against physically barring entrances or exits to a facility that is the subject of a nonviolent protest demonstration; and

WHEREAS, the County of Pottawattamie County endorses a policy prohibiting the use of excessive force and will inform all law enforcement agencies within its jurisdiction of this policy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the County of Pottawattamie County hereby prohibits any law enforcement agency operating within its jurisdiction from using excessive force against any individuals engaged in nonviolent civil rights demonstrations. In addition, The County of Pottawattamie County agrees to enforce any applicable state or local laws against physically barring entrances or exits from a facility or location that is the subject of a nonviolent protest demonstration.

The County of Pottawattamie County further pledges enforcement of this policy within its jurisdiction and encourages any individual or group who feels that the County of Pottawattamie County has not complied with this policy to file a complaint.
