WHEREAS, Pottawattamie County proposes to improve existing conditions of H10 with turning lanes and HMA resurfacing

WHEREAS, RISE funds of \$2,500,000.00 are requested to partially fund the project and will be matched by EDA grant and stakeholder contributions for the roadway improvement project; and

- j) acquisition and development of land for a public park or other recreation or conservation purpose, including a shower facility at Arrowhead Park;
- k) acquisition and development of land for a public park or other recreation or conservation purpose, including entrance renovation, a 3 lane entry and additional parking at Hitchcock Park; and
- l) acquisition and development of land for a public park or other recreation or conservation purpose, including road resurfacing at County Parks,

(the "Project"), and it is deemed necessary and advisable that General Obligation Capital Loan Notes, Series 2020A, in the amount of \$3,030,000 be issued; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has taken such acts as are necessary to authorize issuance of the Notes.



WHEREAS, the proposed Area is within two miles of the corporate boundaries the City of Council Bluffs, Iowa, and accordingly, the County has received the consent of the City of Council Bluffs in the form of a joint agreement to allow the County to operate within the proposed Area, which agreement is hereby approved in all respects and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the Urban Renewal Area be redeveloped as described in the proposed Urban Renewal Plan to be known hereafter as the "Pottawattamie County Industrial Park Urban Renewal Plan"; and

WHEREAS, by resolution adopted on May 26, 2020, this Board directed that a consultation be held with the designated representatives of all affected taxing entities to discuss the proposed Urban Renewal Plan and the division of revenue described therein, and that notice of the consultation and a copy of the proposed Urban Renewal Plan be sent to all affected taxing entities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to such notice, the consultation was duly held as ordered by the Board of Supervisors and all required responses to the recommendations made by the affected taxing entities, if any, have been timely made as set forth in the report of the County's designated representative to the consultation meeting, filed herewith and incorporated herein by this reference, which report is in all respects approved; and

WHEREAS, by resolution this Board also set a public hearing on the adoption of the proposed Urban Renewal Plan for the July 14, 2020 meeting of the Board of Supervisors, and due and proper notice of the public hearing was given, as provided by law, by timely publication in the Daily Nonpareil, the Avoca Journal Herald, and the Oakland Herald, which notice set forth the time and place for the hearing and the nature and purpose thereof; and

WHEREAS, at the July 14, 2020 meeting, this Board opened the public hearing and voted to continue the public hearing to this date and time; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the notice, all persons or organizations desiring to be heard on the proposed Urban Renewal Plan, both for and against, have been given an opportunity to be heard with respect thereto and due consideration has been given to all comments and views expressed to this Board in connection therewith and the public hearing has been closed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF POTTAWATTAMIE COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. That the findings and conclusions set forth or contained in the proposed "Pottawattamie County Industrial Park Urban Renewal Plan" for the area of Pottawattamie County, State of Iowa, legally described and depicted in the Plan and incorporated herein by reference (which area shall hereinafter be known as the "Pottawattamie County Industrial Park Urban Renewal Area"), be and the same are hereby adopted and approved as the findings of this Board for this area.

Section 2. This Board further finds:

a) Although relocation is not expected, a feasible method exists for the relocation of any families who will be displaced from the Urban Renewal Area into decent, safe and sanitary dwelling accommodations within their means and without undue hardship to such families;

b) The Urban Renewal Plan conforms to the general plan for the development of the County as a whole; and

c) Acquisition by the County is not immediately expected, however, as to any areas of open land to be acquired by the County included within the Urban Renewal Area:

i. Residential use is not expected, however, with reference to any portions thereof which are to be developed for residential uses, this Board of Supervisors hereby determines that a shortage of housing of sound standards and design with decency, safety and sanitation exists within the County; that the acquisition of the area for residential uses is an integral part of and essential to the program of the municipality; and that one or more of the following conditions exist:

a. That the need for housing accommodations has been or will be increased as a result of the clearance of slums in other areas, including other portions of the urban renewal area.

b. That conditions of blight in the municipality and the shortage of decent, safe and sanitary housing cause or contribute to an increase in and spread of disease and crime, so as to constitute a menace to the public health, safety, morals, or welfare.

c. That the provision of public improvements related to housing and residential development will encourage housing and residential development which is necessary to encourage the retention or relocation of industrial and commercial enterprises in this state and its municipalities.

d. The acquisition of the area is necessary to provide for the construction of housing for low and moderate income families.

ii. Non-residential use is expected and with reference to those portions thereof which are to be developed for non-residential uses, such non-residential uses are necessary and appropriate to facilitate the proper growth and development of the County in accordance with sound planning standards and local community objectives.

Section 3. That the Urban Renewal Area is an economic development area within the meaning of Chapter 403, Code of Iowa; that such area is eligible for designation as an urban renewal area and otherwise meets all requisites under the provisions of Chapter 403, Code of Iowa; and that the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, development, or a combination thereof, of such area is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety or welfare of the residents of this County.

Section 4. That the Urban Renewal Plan, attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by reference, be and the same is hereby approved and adopted as the "Pottawattamie County Industrial Park Urban Renewal Plan for the Pottawattamie County Industrial Park Urban Renewal Area"; the Urban Renewal Plan for such area is hereby in all respects approved; the Chairperson and County Auditor are authorized to execute the Joint City-County Agreement; and the County Auditor is hereby directed to file a certified copy of the Urban Renewal Plan with the proceedings of this meeting.

**SECTION 4 - EFFECTIVE DATE:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

**WHEREAS**, by Resolution No. 59-2020, adopted July 21, 2020, this Board found and determined that certain areas located within the County are eligible and should be designated as an urban renewal area under Iowa law, and approved and adopted the Pottawattamie County Industrial Park Urban Renewal Plan (the "Urban Renewal Plan" or "Plan") for the Pottawattamie County Industrial Park Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area" or "Area") described therein, which Plan, is on file in the office of the Recorder of Pottawattamie County; and

**WHEREAS**, it is desirable that properties within the Area be redeveloped as part of the overall redevelopment area covered by said Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, the County has received a proposal from Armstrong Investments, LLC (the "Developer"), in the form of a proposed Development Agreement (the "Agreement") by and between the County and the Developer, pursuant to which, among other things, the Developer would agree to prepare for development certain real property located within the Urban Renewal Area as defined and legally described in the Agreement (the "Development Property") by platting the Development Property to create multiple lots for industrial businesses, constructing water infrastructure to provide water service to the lots, and marketing the lots for sale to industrial businesses, which businesses are anticipated to create jobs and income through their operations on the Development Property; and

**WHEREAS**, the Agreement further proposes that the County will construct certain Public Improvements (as defined in the Agreement), including storm sewer infrastructure and streets to facilitate the development of lots for industrial businesses on the Development Property, under the terms and following satisfaction of the conditions set forth in the Agreement; and

**WHEREAS**, the County and the Iowa Department of Transportation have entered into a separate agreement under the Iowa Department of Transportation's RISE program, pursuant to which the County would receive a RISE grant to help finance the Public Improvements; and

WHEREAS, as security for the County's costs of constructing the Public Improvements, the

Agreement would require the Developer to make certain payments to the County, including the Shortfall Payments and Rise Grant Reimbursement Payments (as those terms are defined in the Agreement), if the Development Property is not developed as contemplated in the Agreement, all under the terms and conditions of the Agreement; and

**WHEREAS**, Chapters 15A and 403, Code of Iowa, authorize counties to make grants for economic development in furtherance of the objectives of an urban renewal project and to appropriate such funds and make such expenditures as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of said Chapters, and to levy taxes and assessments for such purposes; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board has determined that the Agreement is in the best interests of the County and the residents thereof and that the performance by the County of its obligations thereunder is a public undertaking and purpose and in furtherance of the Plan and the Urban Renewal Law and, further, that the Agreement and the County's performance thereunder is in furtherance of appropriate economic development activities and objectives of the County within the meaning of Chapters 15A and 403, Code of Iowa, taking into account any or all of the factors set forth in Chapter 15A, Code of Iowa, to wit:

- a. Businesses that add diversity to or generate new opportunities for the Iowa economy should be favored over those that do not.
- b. Development policies in the dispensing of the funds should attract, retain, or expand businesses that produce exports or import substitutes, or which generate tourism-related activities.
- c. Development policies in the dispensing or use of the funds should be targeted toward businesses that generate public gains and benefits, which gains and benefits are warranted in comparison to the amount of the funds dispensed.
- d. Development policies in dispensing the funds should not be used to attract a business presently located within the state to relocate to another portion of the state unless the business is considering in good faith to relocate outside the state or unless the relocation is related to an expansion which will generate significant new job creation. Jobs created as a result of other jobs in similar Iowa businesses being displaced shall not be considered direct jobs for the purpose of dispensing funds; and

**SECTION 1** - **AMENDMENTS:** That the Pottawattamie County, Iowa, Code, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following new Chapter to be codified as Chapter 12, All-terrain and Off-road Vehicles to read as follows:

Vehicles shall be equipped with tail lamp or lamps mounted on the rear of the vehicle, exhibiting a red light plainly visible from a distance of 500 feet to the rear. The tail lamps shall be mounted not less than 15 inches, nor more than 72 inches, above the roadway.
12.04.06	Vehicles shall be equipped with a stop lamp that is actuated by the brake switch to indicate braking of the vehicle.
12.04.07	Vehicles shall be equipped with a DOT rated tire which shall display the proper markings on the sidewall of the tire.
12.04.08	Vehicles shall be equipped with a rear facing mirror and shall provide the operator with a clear view of the rear.
12.05	<b>REQUIREMENTS OF OPERATION:</b> Individuals who operate on roadways in Pottawattamie County must adhere to all applicable County Ordinances and provisions of the Iowa Code. In addition to the provisions of Iowa Code Chapters 321 and 321I, the following conditions apply:

12.06.01	Every all-terrain or off-road vehicle operated upon roadways of Pottawattamie County shall be registered annually with the County Recorder and be required to pay a registration fee in such amount established by the Board. The operator of each all- terrain or off-road vehicle shall be required to provide, upon request by any peace officer, proof of ownership including but not limited to bill of sale or registration. This requirement shall be satisfied if an all-terrain or off-road vehicle is in compliance with the registration requirements of any state within the United States of America. A person shall not operate an all-terrain or off-road vehicle unless the operator has a valid driver's license issued by any state within the United States of America.

12.07	<b><u>VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES</u></b> : The penalty for violating the provisions of this Chapter shall be as set forth in Chapter 1.75.
12.08	<b><u>FEE SCHEDULE:</u></b> The fee schedule as set forth in Chapter 1.50 is hereby established for matters pertaining to this Ordinance.

**SECTION 2** - **SEVERABILITY:** That should any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, that decision shall not effect that validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

**SECTION 3 – REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES:** That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 4** - **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication, as by law provided.

The determination of value or valuation for new construction per square foot under any of the provisions of the adopted Codes shall be as currently published in the International Code Council "Building Safety" Journal. For residential one and two family, the square foot construction cost shall be 76% of the table valuation, effective September 1, 2007. Annually, in June, the Board of Supervisors may review the this percentage to determine if the fees collected are adequate to cover expenses incurred in the operation of the Building and

Safety Division. If, in the opinion of the Building Official, the valuation is underestimated on the application for remodeling, the Building Official shall require the applicant can show detailed estimates to meet the approval of the Building Official.
