### POTTAWATTAMIE COUNTY, IOWA ORDINANCE NO. 2021-06

**AN ORDINANCE** to amend the following in Chapter 3.20 Conservation Board Lands Rules and Regulations:

Amend Section 3.20.040, Use of Motor Vehicles On Areas.

### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF POTTAWATTAMIE COUNTY, IOWA

SECTION 1 - REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES: That section 3.20.040 Use of Motor Vehicles On Areas, is hereby repealed in its entirety. Furthermore all other Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

SECTION 2 – AMENDMENTS: That the Pottawattamie County, Iowa, Code, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following new Section, to be codified as Section 3.20.040 USE OF MOTOR VEHICLES, ALL-TERRAIN / OFF-ROAD VEHICLES and GOLF CARTS ON AREAS:

3.20.040 USE OF MOTOR VEHICLES, ALL-TERRAIN / OFF-ROAD VEHICLES and GOLF CARTS ON AREAS: All driving and parking shall be confined to roadways or parking areas (gravel, sealcoat, asphalt or concrete surfacing). No vehicle shall be permitted to obstruct the roadway. Vehicles shall be parked in designated parking areas. The use of all-terrain and/or offroad vehicles at Arrowhead Park, Botna Bend Park, Hitchcock Nature Center, Narrows River Park and Old Town Park in Pottawattamie County must follow Chapter 12; All-terrain and Off-road Vehicles, Sections 12.01 - 12.08 of county ordinance #2020-03 adopted 09/11/2020 and municipality ordinances adopted within the county. Use in the parks shall be restricted to roadways and parking areas. Golf carts must have all required equipment and comply with all regulations to operate on roadways (street legal) and parking areas in the county parks identified above. Individuals operating golf carts must have a valid driver's license. All other wildlife and habitat areas prohibit the use of allterrain and off-road vehicles except accessing parking areas on adjacent county roads. The maximum speed limit shall be twenty (20) miles per hour within conservation areas, unless posted otherwise.

SECTION 3 - SEVERABILITY: If any of the provisions of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances are held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION 4 - EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

- **3.20.010 PURPOSE**: This ordinance is adopted to preserve, protect, and promote the lands and waters under the direction of the Pottawattamie County Conservation Board and to provide for peaceful, orderly use and public safety of citizens using these lands and waters. (Ordinance #92-3/July 17, 1992)
- **3.20.020** <u>APPLICATION OF PROVISIONS</u>: The provisions of this chapter shall apply to all lands, waters, and properties under the jurisdiction of the Pottawattamie County Conservation Board, unless specifically exempted by the Pottawattamie County Conservation Board. Any exempted area will have applicable alternative regulations posted on site. (Ordinance #92-3/July 17, 1992)
- 3.20.030 PROHIBITED DESTRUCTIVE ACTS: It shall be unlawful for any person to destroy, remove, injure or deface plant life, natural features, wild animals, buildings, or other property, or to construct or operate for private or commercial purpose any business or structure, or to remove sand, ice, earth, stone, wood, or other natural material, within the boundaries of areas under Conservation Board jurisdiction. Legal hunting of some animals is allowed on areas so designated. Mushrooms and berry picking is allowed on areas so designated. (Ordinance #92-3/July 17, 1992)
- 3.20.040 <u>USE OF MOTOR VEHICLES, ALL-TERRAIN / OFF-ROAD VEHICLES and GOLF CARTS ON AREAS</u>: All driving and parking shall be confined to roadways or parking areas (gravel, sealcoat, asphalt or concrete surfacing). No vehicle shall be permitted to obstruct the roadway. Vehicles shall be parked in designated parking areas. The use of all-terrain and/or off-road vehicles at Arrowhead Park, Botna Bend Park, Hitchcock Nature Center, Narrows River Park and Old Town Park in Pottawattamie County must follow Chapter 12; All-terrain and Off-road Vehicles, Sections 12.01 12.08 of county ordinance #2020-03 adopted

09/11/2020 and municipality ordinances adopted within the county. Use in the parks shall be restricted to roadways and parking areas. Golf carts must have all required equipment and comply with all regulations to operate on roadways (street legal) and parking areas in the county parks identified above. Individuals operating golf carts must have a valid driver's license. All other wildlife and habitat areas prohibit the use of all-terrain and off-road vehicles except accessing parking areas on adjacent county roads. The maximum speed limit shall be twenty (20) miles per hour within conservation areas, unless posted otherwise. (Ordinance #92-3/July 17, 1992)

- **3.20.050 DOMESTIC ANIMALS**: No privately-owned animal shall be allowed to run at large. Animals must be controlled by a leash not exceeding six (6) feet in length or confined in a vehicle. Where riding horses is permitted, they shall be kept bridled and under control of the rider. (*Ordinance* #92-3/July 17, 1992)
- **3.20.060** FIRES: No fire shall be built, except in designated area, and such fire shall be extinguished when the site is vacated. Board staff may prohibit all fires in an area. (Ordinance #92-3/July 17, 1992)
- **3.20.070** FIREARMS. FIREWORKS. ETC.: The possession and use by the public of firearms, fireworks, explosives and weapons of all kinds is prohibited. Firearms may be used in areas designated by said Board as hunting areas or specifically set apart as a firing or trap shoot range. (Ordinance #92-3/July 17, 1992)
- 3.20.080 <u>LITTERING</u>: No persons shall place any waste, refuse, litter, or foreign substance in any area or receptacle except those provided for that purpose. Receptacles are provided to accommodate waste from park use. Therefore, only related park-use waste will be accepted. No person shall place personal or non-park waste into area receptacles or onto Board lands. (Ordinance #92-3/July 17, 1992)
- **3.20.090 PROHIBITED AREAS**: No person shall enter any portion of County Conservation areas in disregard of official signs forbidding same, except by permission of the Board or its authorized staff. (Ordinance #92-3/July 17, 1992)
- **3.20.100** HOURS OF USE: Except by arrangement or permission granted by the County Conservation Board or staff, all persons shall vacate county conservation areas between the hours of 10:30 P.M. and 6:30 A.M. of the following day, or as posted at each area. (Ordinance #92-3/July 17, 1992)
- **3.20.110 FEES**: The County Conservation Board may establish fees and admissions for the use of all areas, facilities, buildings and services. Persons unwilling to meet such fees can be excluded from the given conservation area. (Ordinance #92-3/July 17, 1992)
- 3.20.120 <u>CAMPING AREAS</u>: No person shall camp in any portion of a county area except in portions prescribed for that purpose. Any person who camps on any county area shall register name and address with the Park Ranger and advise when the camp is vacated. No person shall be permitted to camp in a park or preserve longer than a period of two (2) weeks consecutively. After a two (2) week consecutive stay, person shall vacate all camping areas in that park and not return to camp in that

park for a period of at least seventy-two (72) hours after departure. Park officers are given authority to refuse camping privileges and to rescind any and all permits for just cause. No vehicle or trailer shall be left unattended for a period longer than twenty-four (24) hours in any area. Any such vehicle or trailer left unattended for a period of twenty-four (24) hours may be towed away at the expense of the registered owner. (Ordinance #93-4/April 16, 1993)

**3.20.130 BOATING REGULATIONS**: Boating is allowed on those bodies of water specifically designated. All boats must be seaworthy. The Board may fix speed,

- wake or horsepower limits for all boats operating on water located within or running through any county area. (Ordinance #92-3/July 17, 1992)
- **3.20.140 DISORDERLY CONDUCT**: No person shall use language or conduct that is threatening, abusive, insulting, profane, or indecent or be guilty of any act that constitutes a breach of peace in any county area under the jurisdiction of the County Conservation Board. (Ordinance #92-3/July 17, 1992)
- 3.20.145 CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL: Beer (with an alcohol content 5% or less by weight) and wine (with an alcohol content 17% or less by weight) may be consumed in camping areas of county parks and recreation areas. Drinking of these beverages is not permitted on roads, in common areas or in parking areas. Keg beer is not permitted. Hard liquor (such as whiskey, vodka, etc.), wine with an alcohol content of more than 17 percent by weight or other alcoholic liquors are not to be consumed in any county parks and recreation areas. Only persons renting the park shelters at the Narrows River Park shall be permitted to consume or possess alcoholic beverages at the Narrows River Park. Alcoholic beverages may not be consumed outside of the rented park shelters at the Narrows River Park. (Ordinance #2016-05/September 2, 2016)
- **3.20.150 <u>VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES</u>**: The penalty for violating the provisions of this Chapter shall be as set forth in Chapter 1.75. (Ordinance #98-6/July 24, 1998)

#### **Deb Petersen/ Petersen Law**

Discussion and/or decision to accept or reject the petition to establish a Secondary Road Assessment District on Honeysuckle Road, from 185<sup>th</sup> Street to the Dead End, and set a Public Hearing date for November 2, 2021 at 10 A.M. if the petition is accepted.

#### PETITION FOR SECONDARY ROAD ASSESSMENT

#### **Honeysuckle Road**

We the undersigned, being more than 50% of the owners of the land within the proposed district, the description of which follows, petition the Pottawattamie County Board of Supervisors as follows:

- I. That the Board accept this petition for formation of a Secondary Road Assessment District under the provisions of Chapter 311.6 of the Code of Iowa.
- II. That said Road included in this district is as follows:
  - 1. A County Road commonly referred to as "Honeysuckle Road" located on the North line of Section 7 of Garner Township, starting at 185th and continuing East approximately 3510 feet (0.66 miles) to the end of the public road at the West end of the dam.
- III. That said road be improved by asphalt stabilization of a compacted base, tack coat and seal coat surfacing, as well as, Intersection widening at Lookout Lane.
- IV. That there be a 74% assessment to the property owners for the estimated cost of this work above and beyond that of maintaining the existing granular surfaced road. Said costs are outlined in the Engineer's report dated August 31, 2021.
- V. That the lands included in the district are all residents either adjacent to Honeysuckle Road or which have access to Honeysuckle Road by means of a private road.
- VI. That costs are to be divided equally between the Twenty-two (22) Petitioner property parcels.
- VII. Petitioners recognize that delays may occur because of weather, equipment availability, contractor availability, material availability, etc. Petitions must be approved the October 1<sup>st</sup> prior to the year of construction; construction before that may occur if possible.
- VIII. Petitioners also recognize that their cost is estimated to be a declining payment of \$670 the first year down to \$483 in the tenth year.
- IX. The method of apportionment to property owners is described as follows: Each resident is assessed \$4,623. Annual payments will be \$462 plus interest.

WHEREFORE, we the undersigned residents along Honeysuckle Road in Pottawattamie County, Iowa, petition the Board for establishment at the earliest possible date as authorized by law a Secondary Road Assessment district as described.

# SECONDARY ROAD ASSESSMENT DISTRICTS – IOWA CODE CHAPTER 311 RELEVANT SECTIONS FOR HONEYSUCKLE ROAD

- This section gives the Board of Supervisors the authority to establish a Secondary Road Assessment District to provide for grading, draining, bridging, aggregate surfacccing, paving, or resurfacing.
- The District shall not be more than a half mile wide. This requirement is met.
- The special assessment to the property owners cannot be less than 50% of the total estimated cost of improvement. It is apportioned and levied on the **lands included** in the District.
- The petition must describe the road and the nature of the proposed improvements, the percentage of cost to be assessed and the lands to be included in the District. It is to be signed by 50% of the owners of the lands within the proposed District or 50% of the owners of the land who reside within the county.

Here there are 22 owners and 11 have voted "yes" so that meets the 50% requirement. The parcels owned by Kain Trust and Ronald Gillett, Sr. should be excluded from the District, as their property, while a tiny portion is adjacent to Honeysuckle, do not access their parcels from Honeysuckle, but rather from paved 185<sup>th</sup> Street. That brings the owners down to 20 and 11 "yes" votes is over 50%.

If we consider only "parcels" then there are 24 parcels (excluding Kain and Gillett) and then there are 12 "yes" votes, as one "yes" owns 2 parcels.

There was some discussion about parcels being owned by multiple owners and allowing those multiple owners to have multiple votes. That simply does not make any sense, as any owner could then transfer his or her property to a multitude of owners simply to swing the vote. And, that multitude of owners should not be entitled to multiple votes when they will not receive multiple assessments.

- This provision discusses the County Engineer's report which has been submitted.
- The Board shall fix a time and place of hearing and the details shall be published in accordance with this section. The notice also advises that the amount apportioned to any tract or parcel can be increased or decreased without further notice. Thus the Board has the final say.

Contrary to the comment last week, the **owners** cannot opt out of paying. That is up to the Board and there really is no provision to simply leave a parcel in the District out of paying. When taxes or assessments are issued, the taxpayer doesn't have the "right to opt out."

At the final hearing, the Board may reject, approve, or modify and approve the proposal. The Board may exclude lands from the District or may add lands to the District or otherwise modify the proposal.

This is where we think you can exclude lands such as Kain and Gillett that do not benefit from any road improvement.

- At the final hearing, the Board shall hear and determine all objections which are filed. The Board has the power to increase, diminish, annul or affirm the apportionment or any part thereof.
- This section provides for the payment of assessments, if elected by the owner, in 10 equal installments, with interest.

Does Honeysuckle Road need to be improved with a hard surface? Well at least half of the property owners along Honeysuckle and those who use it frequently believe so. There was a lot of discussion last week about the condition of Leisure Avenue being a "tough road". We would like to show you some videos of what Honeysuckle Road looks like when it is "tough".
