RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY ENGINEER TO CLOSE SECONDARY ROADS FOR CONSTRUCTION AND/OR MAINTENANCE.

WHEREAS, Section 306.41 of the Code of Iowa, 2002, provides that "The agency having jurisdiction and control over any highway in the state, or the chief engineer of said agency when delegated by such agency, may temporarily close sections of a highway by formal resolution entered upon the minutes of such agency when reasonably necessary because of construction, reconstruction, maintenance, or natural disaster and shall cause to be erected ROAD CLOSED signs and partial or total barricades in the roadway at each end of the closed highway section and on the closed highway where that highway is intersected by other highways if such intersection remains open. Any numbered road closed over forty-eight hours shall have a designated detour route. The agency having jurisdiction over a section of highway closed in accordance with the provisions of

this section, or the persons or contractors employed to carry out the construction, reconstruction, or maintenance of the closed section of highway, shall not be liable for any damages to any vehicle that enters the closed section of highway or the contents of such vehicle or for any injuries to any person that enters the closed section of highway, unless the damages are caused by gross negligence of the agency or contractor,"

Consenting to and approving the plans for the improvement of the extension of Secondary Road G30 (Magnolia Road) within the City of Underwood, Iowa ("City").

WHEREAS, Pottawattamie County proposes to improve Magnolia Road within the City of Underwood, Iowa in accordance with plans filed in the office of the Clerk of said City as follows:

Remove and Replace Pavement and reconstruct Mosquito Creek Bridge to support turn lanes as necessitated by the Jack Links Expansion project, identified as project number $\underline{FM-CO78(TBD)}$ — $\underline{55-78}$, and

WHEREAS, the City has informed itself as to the proposed improvement and has examined the plans thereof,

WHEREAS, the City recognizes the County will develop the project and the City supports the proposed improvements, the Jack Links Expansion, and grant applications made by the County for this project.

WHEREAS, the City is aware that the purpose of the agreement is to apply for and secure RISE funding. Failure to receive RISE funding will terminate this agreement and future project development would require a separate agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the said Council of the City of Underwood, as follows:

- 1. The City hereby approves the plans for the said project and consents to the improvement in accordance with the plans.
- 2. The City will take such legal steps and procedures to a conclusion such legal action and/or proceedings as are now or may hereafter be required.
 - a. To legally establish the grade lines of the street in accordance with and as shown by the project plans, and to cause any damage accruing there from to be determined and paid pursuant to Iowa Code Section 364.15.
 - b. To take such steps as may be necessary to secure the consent to the removal of any trees that may interfere with the construction of the project.
 - c. To remove existing and prevent future encroachments and obstructions upon streets or highways covered by the project.
 - d. To remove or cause to be removed without expense to the County all water hydrants, curb boxes, electroliers and cables, poles, parking meters, traffic signals, and any other facilities or obstructions which interfere with the construction of the project.

All above ground utilities shall be placed as close to the right of way line as practical.

- 3. Since this project may be partly financed with Federal-aid funds, the grant of which requires that the Iowa Department of Transportation (Iowa DOT) and the County comply with federal laws and regulations with respect thereto, the City agrees to take such action as may be necessary to comply with such federal laws and regulations. (Approval of the plans by the City satisfies the requirements of this paragraph.)
- 4. The City further agrees that within the limits of the proposed surfacing and for one foot outside thereof where the City or utility companies may be digging ditches prior to the proposed surfacing, the City will require that all backfilling and compaction of ditches shall be made in accordance with the Iowa DOT's current Standard Specifications. The work will be subject to the approval of the County.
- 5. The City will, by ordinance, prohibit or restrict diagonal parking throughout the project.
- 6. Upon completion of the project, the City agrees that:
 - a. Any changes in the physical features of the project will be authorized only after approval has been secured from the County.

POTTAWATTAMIE COUNTY CDBG PROPERTY ACQUISITION ACTIVITIES

A. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS TO DATE

In fall of 2021 work began on the acquisition and demolition of flood damaged properties in Pottawattamie County. To date, the County has procured administrative, appraisal, abstracting and legal, asbestos inspection and testing, and building demolition services. As of the date of this report, 8 properties have been acquired and 6 properties demolished using HMGP and CDBG funds. The remaining 2 homes will be demolished by June 15, 2022.

B. SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES TO DATE

- Though the project is principally financed with grants from FEMA, Pottawattamie County received a CDBG award of \$500,324 on January 27, 2022, to assist with state and local match requirements. As of 5/31/2022, a total of \$354,140 in CDBG funds have been received by the County.
- The total expected cost for the project is \$2,232,792 and \$1,861,054.17 in project costs have been incurred as of May 31, 2022.

C. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF REMANING WORK

All 8 homes have been acquired and 6 have been demolished as of May 31, 2022. The remaining 2 homes will be demolished by June 15, 2022.

D. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF CHANGES MADE TO THE PROJECT BUDGET, PERFORMANCE TARGETS, ACTIVITY SCHEDULE, PROJECT SCOPE, LOCATION, OBJECTIVES OR BENEFICIARIES

No significant changes have been made to the project budget, performance targets, or project scope. The project schedule was changed twice, first with a 90-day extension of the March 15, 2022, deadline for demolition of the homes and then also due to an extended environmental review by FEMA on 2 of the homes in the program. The first 6 homes were demolished and clear site by April 8, 2022. Work is currently underway for the demolition of the final 2 homes, with a deadline of June 15, 2022.

RESOLUTION NO. 42-2022 CODE OF CONDUCT

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Code of Conduct is to ensure the efficient, fair, and professional administration of federal grant funds in compliance with 2 CFR Part 200.318 and other applicable federal and state standards, regulations, and laws.

APPLICATION

This Code of Conduct applies to all officers, employees, or agents of Pottawattamie County, Iowa engaged in the award or administration of contracts supported by federal grant funds.

REQUIREMENTS

No officer, employee, or agent of Pottawattamie County, Iowa shall participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by federal grant funds, if a conflict of interest, real or apparent, would be involved. Such a conflict would arise when:

- a. The employee, officer, or agent;
- b. Any member of his/her immediate family;
- c. His/her partner; or
- d. An organization which employs, or is about to employ any of the above; or, has a financial or other interest in the firm selected for award.

The Pottawattamie County, Iowa officers, employees, or agents shall neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors, or anything of monetary value from contractors, potential contractors, or subcontractors.

FRAUD, WASTE AND ABUSE

Pottawattamie County, Iowa has zero tolerance for the commission or concealment of acts of fraud, waste, or abuse. All officers, employees, or agents shall notify the County of Pottawattamie, Iowa of suspected actions. Allegations of such acts will be investigated and pursued to their logical conclusion, including legal action where warranted. Concerns may be reported to (contact at Recipient, address and phone number of contact).

REMEDIES

To the extent permitted by federal, state, or local laws or regulations, violation of these standards may cause penalties, sanctions, or other disciplinary actions to be taken against Pottawattamie County, Iowa officers, employees, or agents, or the contractors, potential contractors, subcontractors, or their agents.

RESOLUTION NO. 45-2022 Community Development Block Grant Subrecipient Procurement Policies and Procedures

2 *CFR* 200.317 provides that subrecipients of a state that are administering federal funds will follow sections 200.318 (General procurement standards) through 200.326 (Contract provisions). However, 24 *CFR* 570.489(g), set out in full below, enables states that administer Community Development Block Grant funds to adopt procurement standards other than those set out in 2 *CFR* Part 200 for units of local government that are subrecipients of CDBG funds.

24 CFR 570.489 (g) Procurement: When procuring property or services to be paid for in whole or in part with CDBG funds, the State shall follow its procurement policies and procedures. The State shall establish requirements for procurement policies and procedures for units of general local government, based on full and open competition. Methods of procurement (e.g., small purchase, sealed bids/formal advertising, competitive proposals, and noncompetitive proposals) and their applicability shall be specified by the State. Cost plus a percentage of cost and percentage of construction costs methods of contracting shall not be used. The policies and procedures shall also include standards of conduct governing employees engaged in the award or administration of contracts. (Other conflicts of interest are covered by § 570.489(h).) The State shall ensure that all purchase orders and contracts include any clauses required by Federal statutes, Executive orders, and implementing regulations. The State shall make subrecipient and contractor determinations in accordance with the standards in 2 CFR 200.330.

The State of Iowa, in its administration of the CDBG, hereby establishes the following procurement standards for subrecipients of CDBG funding that are units of local government.

Procurement Standards

General (Replaces 2 CFR 200.318)

Subrecipients of the CDBG program must maintain oversight to ensure that contractors perform in accordance with the terms, conditions, and specifications of their contracts or purchase orders.

The subrecipient alone shall be responsible, in accordance with good administrative practice and sound business judgment, for the settlement of all contractual and administrative issues arising out of procurements. These issues include, but are not limited to, source evaluation, protests, disputes, and claims. These standards do not relieve the subrecipient of any contractual responsibilities under its contracts.

Conflicts of interest in awarding contracts (Replaces 2 CFR 200.318)

The subrecipient must maintain written standards of conduct covering and governing the actions of its employees engaged in the selection, award and administration of contracts. No employee, officer, or agent may participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by a Federal award if he or she has a real or apparent conflict of interest. Such a conflict of interest would arise when the employee, officer, or agent, any member of his or her immediate family, his or her partner, or an organization which employs or is about to employ any of the parties indicated herein, has a financial or other interest in or a tangible personal benefit from a firm considered for a contract. The officers, employees, and agents of the subrecipient may neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors, or anything of monetary value from contractors or parties to subcontracts. If the subrecipient has a parent, affiliate or subsidiary organization that is not a state, local government, or Indian tribe, the subrecipient must also maintain written standards of conduct covering organizational conflicts of interest. Organizational conflicts of interest means that because of relationships with a parent company, affiliate, or subsidiary organization, the subrecipient is unable or appears to be unable to be impartial in conducting a procurement action involving a related organization.

IEDA may terminate contracts with any CDBG subrecipient that violates this policy and may require full repayment of funds issued to the subrecipient.

Best Cost (Replaces 2 CFR 200.318)

The subrecipient's procedures must avoid acquisition of unnecessary or duplicative items. Consideration should be given to consolidating or breaking out procurements to obtain a more economical purchase. Where appropriate, an analysis will be made of lease versus purchase alternatives, and any other appropriate analysis to determine the most economical approach.

The subrecipient is encouraged to use value engineering clauses in contracts for construction projects of sufficient size to offer reasonable opportunities for cost reductions. Value engineering is a systematic and creative analysis of each contract item or task to ensure that its essential function is provided at the overall lower cost.

Responsible Contractors (Replaces 2 CFR 200.318)

The subrecipient must award contracts only to responsible contractors possessing the ability to perform successfully under the terms and conditions of a proposed procurement. Consideration will be given to such matters as contractor integrity, compliance with public policy, record of past performance, and financial and technical resources.

Awards must not be made to parties listed on the governmentwide Excluded Parties List System in the System for Award Management (SAM), in accordance with the OMB guidelines at 2 CFR 180 that implement Executive Orders 12549 (3 CFR Part 1986 Comp., p. 189) and 12689 (3 CFR Part 1989 Comp., p. 235), "Debarment and Suspension." The Excluded Parties List System in SAM contains the names of parties debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded by agencies, as well as parties declared ineligible under statutory or regulatory authority other than Executive Order 12549.

The subrecipient must maintain records sufficient to detail the history of procurement. These records will include, but are not necessarily limited to the following:

- 1. rationale for the method of procurement
- 2. selection of contract type
- 3. contractor selection or rejection
- 4. the basis for the contract price.

Competition (Replaces 2 CFR 200.319)

All procurement transactions must be conducted in a manner providing full and open competition consistent with the standards of this section. In order to ensure objective contractor performance and eliminate unfair competitive advantage, contractors that develop or draft specifications, requirements, statements of work, or invitations for bids or requests for proposals shall be excluded from competing for such procurements. IEDA will consider requests for waivers of this provision. The subrecipient must make a sufficient showing that the number of contractors that provide the goods or services is insufficient that it is necessary to not exclude contractors that developed or drafted specifications, requirements, statements of work, or invitations for bids or requests for proposals.

Examples restrictions on competition include but are not limited to:

- 1. Placing unreasonable requirements on firms in order for them to qualify to do business;
- 2. Requiring unnecessary experience and excessive bonding;
- 3. Noncompetitive pricing practices between firms or between affiliated companies;
- 4. Noncompetitive contracts to consultants that are on retainer contracts;
- 5. Organizational conflicts of interest;
- 6. Specifying only a "brand name" product instead of allowing "an equivalent" product to be offered and describing the performance or other relevant requirements of the procurement; and
- 7. Any arbitrary action in the procurement process.

The subrecipient must conduct procurement in a manner that prohibits the use of statutorily or administratively imposed state, local, or tribal geographical preferences in the evaluation of bids or proposals, except in those cases where applicable Federal or State of Iowa law expressly mandates or encourages geographic preference. Nothing in this section preempts state licensing laws.

When contracting for architectural and engineering (A/E) services, geographic location may be a selection criterion, provided that an appropriate number of qualified firms remain, given the nature and size of the project, to compete for the contract.

The subrecipient must have written procedures for procurement transactions. These procedures must ensure that all solicitations:

- 1. Incorporate a clear and accurate description of the technical requirements for the material, product, or service to be procured. Such description must not, in competitive procurements, contain features which unduly restrict competition. The description may include a statement of the qualitative nature of the material, product or service to be procured and, when necessary, must set forth those minimum essential characteristics and standards to which it must conform if it is to satisfy its intended use. Detailed product specifications should be avoided. When it is impractical or not reasonably feasible to make a clear and accurate description of the technical requirements, a "brand name or equivalent" description may be used as a means to define the performance or other salient requirements of procurement. The specific features of the named brand which must be met by offers must be clearly stated; and
- 2. Identify all requirements which the offerors must fulfill and all other factors to be used in evaluating bids or proposals.

Types of Procurement (Replaces 2 CFR 200.320-based on Iowa Code section 11.118)

- 1. **Small**: Estimated annual value does not exceed \$5,000 and does not exceed \$15,000 for multiyear contracts: For supplies and services only. The subrecipient does not need to solicit competitive quotations if the subrecipient considers the price to be reasonable. To the extent practicable, the subrecipient must distribute such procurement equitably among qualified suppliers.
- 2. **Simple:** Estimated annual value exceeds \$5,000 but less than \$50,000 per year and does not exceed \$150,000 for multiyear contracts: For non-engineering and architectural services and supplies only. The subrecipient may use an informal competitive selection process to engage a service provider. Informal selection means price or rate quotations must be obtained from an adequate number of qualified sources. The subrecipient may contact the prospective service providers in person, by telephone, fax, email or letter. The subrecipient should solicit at least three prospective service providers. The sub recipient must justify, to IEDA's satisfaction, contacting fewer than three service providers. The justification shall be included in the contract file.
- 3. **Professional:** Estimated annual value exceeds \$50,000 per year and exceeds \$150,000 for multiyear contracts: For supplies and services and ALL engineering and architectural services, a subrecipient shall use a formal *competitive selection* process to procure the goods or services.
- 4. **Sealed bids:** (formal advertising): The sealed bid method is the preferred method for procuring construction. Bids are publicly solicited and a firm fixed price contract (lump sum or unit price) is awarded to the responsible bidder whose bid, conforming with all the material terms and conditions of the invitation for bids, is the lowest in price. The procurement lends itself to a firm fixed price contract and the selection of the successful bidder can be made principally on the basis of price. A complete, adequate, and realistic specification or purchase description will be developed before bidding.

The following requirements apply:

1. Bids must be solicited from an adequate number of known suppliers, providing them sufficient response time prior to the date set for opening the bids, and the invitation for bids must be publicly advertised (not required for nonprofit entities);

- 2. The invitation for bids, which will include any specifications and pertinent attachments, must define the items or services in order for the bidder to properly respond;
- 3. All bids will be opened at the time and place prescribed in the invitation for bids, and the bids must be opened publicly;
- 4. The subrecipient shall enter into a firm fixed price contract award with the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. Where specified in bidding documents, factors such as discounts, transportation cost, and life cycle costs must be considered in determining which bid is lowest. Payment discounts will only be used to determine the low bid when prior experience indicates that such discounts are usually taken advantage of; and
- 5. Any or all bids may be rejected if there is a sound documented reason.

<u>Competitive Selection Process:</u> The technique of competitive proposals is normally conducted with more than one source submitting an offer, and either a fixed price or cost-reimbursement type contract is awarded.

It is generally used when a sealed bidding process is not appropriate. If this method is used, the following requirements apply:

- 1. Requests for proposals must be publicized and identify all evaluation factors and their relative importance. Any response to publicized requests for proposals must be considered to the maximum extent practical;
- 2. Proposals must be solicited from an adequate number of qualified sources;
- 3. The subrecipient must have a written method for conducting technical evaluations of the proposals received and for selecting recipients;
- 4. Contracts must be awarded to the responsible firm whose proposal is most advantageous to the program, with price and other factors considered; and
- 5. The subrecipient may use competitive proposal procedures for qualifications-based procurement of architectural/engineering (A/E) professional services whereby competitors' qualifications are evaluated and the most qualified competitor is selected, subject to negotiation of fair and reasonable compensation. The method, where price is not used as a selection factor, can only be used in procurement of A/E professional services. It cannot be used to purchase other types of services though A/E firms are a potential source to perform the proposed effort.

<u>Noncompetitive proposals</u>: Procurement by noncompetitive proposals is procurement through solicitation of a proposal from only one source and may be used only when one or more of the following circumstances apply:

- (1) The item is available only from a single source. This type of procurement is referred to as sole-source procurement;
- (2) The public exigency or emergency for the requirement will not permit a delay resulting from competitive solicitation;
- (3) The Federal awarding agency or pass-through entity expressly authorizes noncompetitive proposals in response to a written request from the non-Federal entity; or
- (4) After solicitation of a number of sources, competition is determined inadequate. This type of procurement is referred to as single-source procurement.

Responsible unit: IEDA project managers verified via monitoring and/or state auditor

Targeted Small Businesses – Minority, Disabled, and Woman Owned Businesses (Replaces 2 CFR 200.321)

The subrecipient must take all necessary affirmative steps to ensure that minority businesses, women's business enterprises, businesses owned by disabled persons, and labor surplus area firms are used when possible.

Affirmative steps must include:

- (1) Placing qualified small and minority businesses, small women's business enterprises, and small businesses owned by disabled persons on solicitation lists. Link to a directory of Targeted Small Businesses in Iowa: https://iowaeda.microsoftcrmportals.com/tsb-search/;
- (2) Ensuring that Targeted Small Businesses are solicited whenever they are potential sources;
- (3) Dividing total requirements, when economically feasible, into smaller tasks or quantities to permit maximum participation by Targeted Small Businesses;
- (4) Establishing delivery schedules, where the requirement permits, which encourage participation by Targeted Small Businesses;
- (5) Using the services and assistance, as appropriate, of such organizations as the Small Business Administration, the Minority Business Development Agency of the Department of Commerce and the Iowa Economic Development Targeted Small Business Program https://www.iowaeconomicdevelopment.com/tsb; and
- (6) Requiring the prime contractor, if subcontracts are to be let, to take the affirmative steps listed in paragraphs (1) through (5) of this section.

Recycled Content and Products (Replaces 2 CFR 200.322)

When appropriate, specifications shall include requirements for the use of recovered materials and products.

The specifications shall not restrict the use of alternative materials, exclude recovered materials, or require performance standards that exclude products containing recovered materials unless the subrecipient seeking the product can document that the use of recovered materials will impede the intended use of the product.

Cost Analysis and Contract Price (Replaces 2 CFR 200.323)

The subrecipient must perform a cost or price analysis in connection with every procurement action in excess of the small, simple and professional acquisition thresholds, including contract modifications. The method and degree of analysis is dependent on the facts surrounding the particular procurement situation, but as a starting point, the subrecipient must make independent estimates before receiving bids or proposals.

The subrecipient must negotiate profit as a separate element of the price for each contract in which there is no price competition and in all cases where cost analysis is performed. To establish a fair and reasonable profit, consideration must be given to the complexity of the work to be performed, the risk borne by the contractor, the contractor's investment, the amount of subcontracting, the quality of its record of past performance, and industry profit rates in the surrounding geographical area for similar work.

Costs or prices based on estimated costs for contracts under the Federal award are allowable only to the extent that costs incurred or cost estimates included in negotiated prices would be allowable for the subrecipient under 2 CFR 200.402 - 406.

The cost plus a percentage of cost and percentage of construction cost methods of contracting shall not be used.

Review of Procurement Documents and Procurement System (Replaces 2 CFR 200.324)

The subrecipient must make available upon request pre-procurement review; procurement documents, such as requests for proposals or invitations for bids; or independent cost estimates, when:

- 1. Requested by IEDA;
- 2. The procurement is expected to exceed the small, simple and professional acquisition thresholds and is to be awarded without competition or only one bid or offer is received in response to a solicitation;

3. The procurement, which is expected to exceed the small, simple and professional acquisition thresholds, specifies a "brand name" product;

IEDA Certification: The subrecipient may request that IEDA certify that its procurement system meets these standards.

Self-certification: The subrecipient may self-certify its procurement system. Such self-certification shall not limit IEDA's right to review and survey the system. If a subrecipient self-certifies its procurement system, the IEDA may rely on written assurances from the subrecipient that it is complying with these standards. The subrecipient must cite specific policies, procedures, regulations, or standards as compliant with these requirements and make its system available for review.

Bonding (Replaces 2 CFR 200.325)

For construction or facility improvement contracts or subcontracts for public improvement projects and multi-family residential buildings, the minimum requirements shall be as follows:

- a. A bid guarantee from each bidder equivalent to five percent of the bid price. The "bid guarantee" must consist of a firm commitment such as a bid bond, certified check, or other negotiable instrument accompanying a bid as assurance that the bidder will, upon acceptance of the bid, execute such contractual documents as may be required within the time specified.
- b. A performance bond for 100 percent of the contract price. A "performance bond" is one executed in connection with a contract to secure fulfillment of all the contractor's obligations under such contract.

A payment bond for 100 percent of the contract price. A "payment bond" is one executed in connection with a contract to ensure that the contractor will pay as required by law all persons supplying labor and material in the execution of the work provided for in the contract.

The subrecipient may petition IEDA to accept its bonding policy, provided that IEDA has made a determination that the Federal interest is adequately protected.

Recipients are expected to comply with all state requirements regarding bonding requirements for public improvement projects: https://www.legis.iowa.gov/docs/code/2019/573.pdf
Recipients should consult with their legal counsel to determine how state requirements may impact their CDBG project.

Contract Provisions (Replaces 2 CFR 200.326)

The subrecipient's contracts must contain the applicable provisions set out in Appendix II of the CDBG Management Guide

WHEREAS, the Water Improvement Project is necessary to provide water service to the Development Property and to promote the development of residential housing thereon (the "Housing Development Project"); and

WHEREAS, Regional Water has requested that the County provide financial assistance in the form of a forgivable loan (the "Forgivable Loan") in order to pay for a portion of the costs of the Water Improvement Project; and

WHEREAS, the County and Regional Water have entered into a certain forgivable loan agreement (the "Original Forgivable Loan Agreement") in connection with the Water Improvement Project and the Forgivable Loan; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to amend the Original Forgivable Loan Agreement in order to extend the completion date of the Water Improvement Project and to extend the maturity date of the Forgivable Loan; and

WHEREAS, an amended forgivable loan agreement (the "Amended Forgivable Loan Agreement") has been prepared to set forth the new understanding between the County and Regional water; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to take action for the approval of the Amended Forgivable Loan Agreement and to make provision for the execution and delivery thereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Pottawattamie County, Iowa, as follows:

- Section 1. Pursuant to the factors listed in Chapter 15A, the Board of Supervisors hereby finds and reaffirms that:

3.50.006.07 Any dog that has been impounded by the County shall have an identifying microchip inserted under its skin at its owner/custodian's expense prior to being released to the owner/custodian.

SECTION 9 - REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES: That section 3.50.007.09 is hereby repealed in its entirety. Furthermore all other Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

SECTION 10 - AMENDMENTS: That the Pottawattamie County, Iowa, Code, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following new Section, to be codified as Section 3.50.007.09:

3.50.007.09 NUMBER RESTRICTED: It is unlawful for any person to own, keep or harbor at anytime more than four (4) dogs under this Chapter without the appropriate permitting, or as otherwise provided for by Chapter 8 – Pottawattamie County, IA Zoning Ordinance.

SECTION 11 - AMENDMENTS: That the Pottawattamie County, Iowa, Code, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following new Section, to be codified as Section 3.50.035:

3.50.035 URBAN CHICKENS:

- .01 Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, the keeping of domestic chickens (members of the subspecies of Gallus gallus domesticus) shall be permitted on properties with a single-family dwelling that have less than one acre of pasture and/or are in the R-3 (Urban Residential) Zoning District, so long as such keeping is in strict compliance with this subsection and all other applicable County ordinances unless, despite compliance with the following, the presence of any particular chickens endangers the health, safety, peace, quiet, comfort, enjoyment of, or otherwise becomes a public nuisance to nearby residents or occupants or places of business.
 - A. No person shall keep chickens inside a single-family dwelling unit.
 - B. A tenant must obtain the landlord's written permission to keep chickens, which shall be submitted as part of the application for a permit.
 - C. Chickens must be confined in a coop or fowl house not less than 18 inches in height or, in the alternative, within a fenced pen area. Chickens must be kept within the coop, the fowl house, or the fenced pen area at all times unless removed for a temporary time for cleaning or for the safety of the chicken. Chickens must be housed in the coop from dusk until dawn.
 - D. The coop, the fowl house, or the fenced pen area shall be located in the rear yard only (as defined in Section 8.002.260.02 of the Pottawattamie County, Iowa Zoning Ordinance), must be of such a design to be reasonably expected to prevent entry by dogs, cats, or other animals, shall be completely enclosed (except fenced pen area), shall be well maintained, and shall be well drained so there is no accumulation of moisture.
 - E. The materials used in making a coop or fowl house (stationary or mobile) shall be uniform for each element of the structure such that the walls are made of the same material, the roof has the same shingles or other covering, and any windows or openings are constructed using the same materials. The use of scrap, waste board, sheet metal, or similar materials is prohibited.
 - F. Any coop, fowl house, or fenced pen area shall be kept clean, sanitary and free from accumulation of chicken excrement and objectionable odors. All droppings and body excretions shall be either placed in fly-proof containers and double-bagged in plastic bags or, in the alternative, used as fertilizer on the same property so long as the droppings and body excretions are spread and incorporated into the soil within twenty-four (24) hours.
 - G. Odors from chickens, chicken manure or other chicken related substances shall not be perceptible beyond the boundaries of the permitted tract of land. Noise from chickens shall not to disturb persons on adjoining properties or beyond based on an objective or reasonable person standard.
 - H. All chicken feed shall be stored in rodent-proof containers.
 - I. No more than twelve (12) chickens shall be kept or maintained per property.
 - J. All chickens shall have wings clipped at any given time so as to eliminate the possibility of flight from the permittee's property.
 - K. All such chickens must be hens; no roosters are permitted.
 - L. The County shall not be liable for injury or death of chickens caused by dogs, cats, or other animals, domestic or wild, whether such animals are licensed by the County or not. Further, injury or death of a chicken caused by an animal is not, in and of itself, sufficient grounds for Animal Control to determine that the animal is a dangerous/vicious animal pursuant to Section 3.50.010. Any dead chicken, not caused by slaughtering, shall be disposed of immediately upon discovering in a manner so as not to cause a nuisance pursuant to Chapter 8, Zoning Ordinance.
 - M. Any slaughter of chickens not regulated by state law or otherwise forbidden or regulated shall be done only in a humane and sanitary manner and shall not be done open to the view of any public area or adjacent property owned by another.

.02 No person shall keep any chickens unless they possess a Pottawattamie County, Iowa Urban Chicken (Hen) Permit issued by Animal Control.

- A. Animal Control shall provide an application form upon request, which shall include consent forms for landlords.
- B. The fees and associated costs shall be set by resolution.
- C. Permits will be granted for one (1) year valid from January 1 through December 31. Permits may be purchased at any time during the year but will be valid only through December 31.
- D. The applicant shall successfully complete an approved class in raising chickens in an urban setting prior to being issued a permit. Animal Control shall maintain a current list of such approved classes.
- E. By the granting of the permit to raise chickens and the application thereof, the permittee authorizes that the County or its agents have the right to go onto permittee's property any time and without prior notice for the limited purpose of inspection of the premises to ensure that all applicable conditions have been met.
- F. Within thirty (30) days after the expiration of any permit, the permittee shall apply for and secure a renewal of the permit in the manner provided for in this chapter. Failure to renew a permit within the time herein provided shall result in a delinquent fee, in addition to the regular permit fee, as set by the Pottawattamie County, Iowa Board of Supervisors. All applicants shall be furnished with permit rules and regulations at the time the application is made.
- G. The permit is a limited license for the activity, and no vested zoning rights arise from the permit being issued.
- H. The permit does not run with the land. Private restrictions on the use of the property shall remain enforceable and shall supersede the permit. The private restrictions include, but are not limited to, deed restrictions, neighborhood association bylaws, covenants and restrictions, and rental agreements. A permit issued to a person whose property is subject to private restrictions that prohibit keeping of chickens is void.
- .03 In the event that an applicant or permittee does not fully and strictly comply with the requirements of this section, the application may be denied or the permit may be revoked. If an application is denied or a permit is revoked, the applicant or permittee shall be so informed in writing and also informed of the right to appeal said decision.
 - A. In any instance where Animal Control has denied, revoked, suspended, or not renewed a permit, the applicant or permit holder may appeal the decision to the Pottawattamie County, Iowa Board of Health within ten (10) business days of receipt by the applicant or holder of the permit of the notice of the decision.
 - B. When an application for a permit is denied or when a permit is revoked:
 - 1. The applicant may not re-apply for a new permit for a period of 1 year from the date of the denial or revocation unless the denial or revocation is due to administrative reasons only, as determined by Animal Control.
 - 2. Any chicken(s) shall be removed immediately.
 - 3. Any coop, fowl house, fencing or other structures shall be removed within ten (10) days of the date of the permit being denied or revoked.
 - C. Animal Control shall issue a permit within 7 to 10 working days from receipt of application.

SECTION 12 - SEVERABILITY: That should any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, that decision shall not effect that validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

SECTION 13 - REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES: That all ordinance or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 14 - EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

CHAPTER 1.50 SCHEDULE OF FEES

- **1.50.010 PURPOSE:** The purpose of this chapter is to set forth those fees and charges authorized to be charged by the County pursuant to specific authorization of the Board of Supervisors, as evidenced herein, or as authorized in other chapters of this Code. The provisions of this Chapter shall constitute authorization for the County Official designated by the respective Titles and/or Chapters within the Titles, to charge and collect the fees and charges set forth herein. If a fee or charge is authorized to be made or charged, such fee or charge is nonetheless authorized to be made or charged, the same as if it were set forth herein. (*Ordinance #2008-02/February 1, 2008*)
- **1.50.020 FEES SET BY RESOLUTION:** Any fees not specifically set forth in this Chapter shall be set and amended by resolution by the Board of Supervisors. The schedule of fees shall be maintained and shall be available for inspection in the Office of Planning and Development. (*Ordinance #2008-02/February 1, 2008*)
- **1.50.030 INVESTIGATION FOR WORK WITHOUT A PERMIT:** Whenever any work for which a permit is required by the Pottawattamie County, Iowa, Code, has commenced without first obtaining said permit, a special investigation shall be made before a permit may be issued for such work. (*Ordinance #2008-02/February 1, 2008*)
- **1.50.040 INVESTIGATION FEE FOR WORK WITHOUT A PERMIT:** An investigation fee, in addition to the permit fee, shall be collected whether or not a permit is then or subsequently issued. The investigation fee shall be double the amount of the permit fee required by the Pottawattamie County, Iowa, Code or as set by resolution by the Board of Supervisors. In the event more than one permit is required prior to commencing said work, the investigation fee shall double the amount of all permit fees required. The payment of such investigation fee shall not exempt any person from compliance with all other provisions of the Pottawattamie County, Iowa, Code, nor from any penalty prescribed by law. (Ordinance #2008-02/February 1, 2008)
- **1.50.050 SITE EVALUATION FEE:** In the event a site evaluation is required by the Pottawattamie County, Iowa, Code, in various chapters, a site evaluation fee shall be charged. The site evaluation fee shall be seventy-five (75) percent of the permit requiring the site evaluation. In the event a site evaluation involves multiple permits, the site evaluation fee shall be fifty (50) percent of the accumulatively total of all permits required. (*Ordinance #2008-02/February 1, 2008*)
- **1.50.060 FEE REFUND:** Fees shall not be entitled to be refunded. (*Ordinance #2009-05/June 5, 2009*)

For residential one and two family, the square foot construction cost shall be 76% of the table valuation, effective September 1, 2007. Annually, in June, the Board of Supervisors may review the this percentage to determine if the fees collected are adequate to cover expenses incurred in the operation of the Building and Safety Division. If, in the opinion of the Building Official, the valuation is underestimated on the application for remodeling, the Building Official shall require the applicant can show detailed estimates to meet the approval of the Building Official. Final building permit valuation shall be set by the Building Official.

- B. 8.004.085.15 Remove "and other structures"
- C. 8.004.085.15 Add "Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, the keeping of domestic chickens (members of the subspecies of Gallus gallus domesticus) shall be permitted on properties with a single-family dwelling that have less than one acre of pasture and/or are in the R-3 (Urban Residential) Zoning District, so long as such keeping is in strict compliance with this subsection and all other applicable County ordinances unless, despite compliance with the following, the presence of any particular chickens endangers the health, safety, peace, quiet , comfort, enjoyment of, or otherwise becomes a public nuisance to nearby residents or occupants or places of business."

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF POTTAWATTAMIE COUNTY, IOWA

SECTION 1 - REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES: That section 8.004.085.15 is hereby repealed in its entirety. Furthermore all other Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

SECTION 2 - AMENDMENTS: That the Pottawattamie County, Iowa, Code, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following new Section, to be codified as Section 8.004.085.15:

8.004.085.15 *Private stables* and other *structures* for raising and keeping animals and fowl, provided that not more than one (1) *animal unit* per acre of pasture shall be permitted and further provided that no such *structure* (to include corrals and other similar portable structures) shall be located closer than fifty (50) feet to any property line, nor shall the animals be kept or pastured closer than twenty-five (25) feet to any *dwelling* on the site. The area devoted to such uses shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition, and shall be maintained so as drainage will not affect the health and safety of adjacent property owners. Private stables shall not be permitted in the R-3 and R-5 Districts. Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, the keeping of domestic chickens (members of the subspecies of Gallus gallus domesticus) shall be permitted on properties with a single-family dwelling that have less than one acre of pasture and/or are in the R-3 (Urban Residential) Zoning District, so long as such keeping is in strict compliance with this subsection and all other applicable County ordinances unless, despite compliance with the following, the presence of any particular chickens endangers the health, safety, peace, quiet, comfort, enjoyment of, or otherwise becomes a public nuisance to nearby residents or occupants or places of business.

SECTION 3 - SEVERABILITY: That should any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, that decision shall not effect that validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

SECTION 4 - REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES: That all ordinance or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5 - EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

WHEREAS, Pottawattamie County proposes to improve Magnolia Road within the City of Underwood, Iowa in accordance with plans filed in the office of the Clerk of said City as follows:

Remove and replace pavement and reconstruct the Mosquito Creek Bridge to support turn lanes as necessitated by the current and future developments ("Project") and,

WHEREAS, the City has informed itself as to the proposed improvements and,

WHEREAS, the City recognizes the County will develop the project and the City supports the proposed improvements, the Jack Links Expansion, and grant applications made by the County for this project and, WHEREAS, the City will receive City Bridge Funds for the Mosquito Creek Bridge (FHWA #288730) and those funds will incorporated into the Project as applicable by the grant requirements and conditions and

WHEREAS, either the City or the County may apply for and receive grant funding for the Project and those funds are to be utilized by the County as the lead agency insofar as these funds meet the intent and purpose of the proposed Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the said Council of the City of Underwood and Pottawattamie County hereby agree to approve the plans for the said project and consents to the proposed Project with the County as the Lead Agency. The City agrees that:

- 3. All Township Trustees and Clerks shall turn in their completed timesheets to the County auditor's Office. Payment shall be made at the end of each quarter for meetings attended during that quarter.
