It rained intermittently all day on Friday, Aug. 6.

By early Saturday morning, the rainfall turned into a deluge and obliterated a record that had stood for nearly a century in south-

The storm that hit Council Bluffs and the surrounding area was an his-

toric and memorable one. In a span of less than 24 hours, it dumped an official measurement of 10.48 inches of rain on the area, breaking the record set in 1903.












